

The 2025 BUGATTI OWNERS' CLUB NEW BARN CARS MOT SPEED CHAMPIONSHIP

1. SPORTING REGULATIONS - GENERAL

1.1 Title & Jurisdiction:

The Bugatti Owners' Club 'New Barn Cars MOT' Championship is organised and administered by the Bugatti Owners' Club in accordance with the National Competition Rules (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations.

1.3 Competitor Eligibility:

Competitors will consist of Experts and Novices.

- 1.3.1 Drivers and Entrant/Drivers must be a fully paid up, valid member of the Bugatti Owners' Club Ltd., be registered for the Championship and be in possession of a valid RS Interclub Competition Licence.
- 1.3.2 Competitors shall not take time off school to participate in motor sport without the prior written approval of their school. If participation in the Championship requires absence from school, Drivers in full time school education are required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from their school in order to fulfil registration for the Championship.
- 1.3.3 All necessary documentation must be available for checking at all rounds when signing-on.
- 1.3.4 To be eligible as a Novice, Competitors must have competed in less than 6 Hill Climbs at the beginning of the season.

- 1.4.2 The registration fee for the Championship is £45.00
- 1.4.3 Competitors must register at least fourteen days before the first event in which they intend to compete.
 - Entry into the Championship commences from the date of registration and points will not be awarded retrospectively.
- 1.4.4 Whilst every effort will be made to circulate event supplementary regulations, the onus is on the entrant to obtain them.
- 1.4.5 Drivers must compete in a minimum of six dedicated rounds to qualify for an end of season award.
- 1.4.6 To be eligible for scoring in the series all competing cars must carry Championship decals as laid down in the advertising rules detailed in the NCR under Ch.6 App.1 Art 9.2 and Ch.6 App.1 Art 9.3. Failure to comply will lead to deleted scores

1.5 The following events form the Qualifying Rounds of the 2025 Championship:

1.6 Scoring:

1.6.1 The Championship will be based on handicap scoring and points scored are based on results from the events entered purely on the order of finish of cars. Points will be awarded as follows,

All points listed below include two for scrutineering and signing on, one for completing a practice run, and one for a completing competitive timed run. Only 1 point will be given for practice and competitive runs regardless of how many are completed.

1st = 30 points

2nd = 25 points

3rd = 22 points

4th = 20 points

5th = 18 points

6th = 16 points

7th = 14 points

8th = 12 points

9th = 10 points

10th = 9 points

11th = 8 points

12th = 7 points

13th = 6 points

14th = 5 points

The rest = 4 points
```

There are ten dedicated rounds. From these rounds the entrants best six results count towards the end of season final scoring.

- 1.6.2 In the event of a tie the overall winner will be decided on the most first places, then the most second places etc. the overall winner will not be eligible for any other award.
- 1.6.3 Any appeals against points must be lodged in accordance with NCR Ch.2 App.5 Art.2
- 1.6.4 Anybody beating their handicap by more than 5% will score a maximum of 4 points.
- 1.6.5 Points will be published regularly on the championship website here: https://www.prescotthillclimb.co.uk/competitors

1.7 Awards:

The overall winner and winners of other named trophies will not be eligible for any other awards.

- 1.7.1 The season will conclude with the 'New Barn Cars Mot' Championship Trophy going to the overall winner with the most points scored in the Championship standings.
- 1.7.4 The Novice of the Year award will be awarded for the best performance by a Novice.
- 1.7.3 The Expert of the Year award will be awarded for the best performance by an Expert.
- 1.7.4 The Peter Stubberfield Trophy will be awarded for the best performance in a Sports Car, with an award for second and third place.
- 1.7.5 The Jack Perkins Plate will be awarded for the best performance in a Saloon Car, with an award for second and third place.
- 1.7.6 A glass award will be awarded to the best Young Driver who is 30 years of age or younger commencing the first round of the season.

3. SPECIFIC CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

- 3.1 By registering for the Championship all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code which is appended to these regulations (Appendix 1).
- 3.1.1. Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate

- penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.
- 3.1.2. It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Coordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report Motorsport UK. 4. TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

4.1 The Bugatti Owners' Club 'New Barn Cars MOT' Speed Championship is open to competitors participating in any road registered and road legal car, to be eligible for the Championship all vehicles must comply with the Common Regulations and Specific Regulations for Standard Cars (Ch.14 App.4 Art.13-16), Road Cars - Series Production (Ch.14 App.4 Art.17.1) and Road Cars - Specialist Production (Ch.14 App.4 Art.17.2) cars in the current NCRs Ch. 14 App. 4, Specific Technical Regulations for Sprint and Hill Climb.

Competitors are reminded that vehicles should be fitted with original interior trim ie: door cards & headlining.

Interior equipment ie: heaters, sunroof, and window mechanisms, door handles etc must be retained & be working.

The organisers reserve the right to decline entries for vehicles considered not in the spirit of the championship.

Note: Competitors are reminded they may need to supply proof of current Insurance Certificates, MOT and vehicle tax. Certificates (if applicable) may be inspected at any round.

5. **ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS**

Motorsport UK are exceedingly concerned of the impact of single-use plastic tyre wrapping and with reusable alternatives available competitors are encouraged to reduce plastic usage in this regard. The use of these plastic wraps is prohibited as per Ch.14 App.3 Art.1.3
